Job Description: Photojournalism Leaders

The Photojournalism program seeks 3rd and 4th Travis Heights Elementary student leaders who exemplify what is great about Travis Heights. The Photojournalism Leadership Team will provide both images and text that will be published on the THES website.

Students meet with Ms. Friedman for a working lunch each week. You are applying for a position on the leadership team which could include work as a photographer or a writer.

Responsibilities:

Safety first. The cameras and computers we use are not toys. The proper candidate will agree to always follow directions and safe practices.

Have a positive attitude and be a team player. The ideal candidate is flexible and focused on the big picture of contributing to get the project done well.

Attend required meetings, events, or communicate in advance that you are not available that week. (Tell me ahead of time you are not available.)

Students must demonstrate professionalism during team events and throughout the school day. The ideal candidate knows how to behave in line, at lunch, and in class.

You MUST deliver on your academic responsibilities. Participation requires that you put the work into your studies and excel to the satisfaction of your teachers and parents.

If you are unable to maintain any of the obligations, you may ask or be asked to resign.

Application:

Interested students must apply to be part of the Photo Journalism Leadership Team. The applications consists of the following items that must be submitted to Ms. Friedman by noon on Friday, April 15 to be considered. You may follow the form provided, though you should use blank or lined paper. It must be in your handwriting, in YOUR OWN WORDS and your best effort. If you have trouble reading, writing, or filling out the application, then please ask your teacher or parents for help. You may also contact Ms. Friedman by phone to arrange time to get help after school or during lunch. These are the items you <u>must</u> return.

- 2. Parent permission, signed
- 3. Teacher recommendation, signed
- 4. Media release, signed by parent

Your cover letter should have at least three paragraphs.

Introduction. At least two sentences that include who you are (your name) and why you are writing (to apply for a leadership position on the journalism team).

Body. At least three sentences. Describe why you want to be on a photo journalism team. Describe talents, characteristics you bring. (What strengths do you have that could help the team?) What specific position are you most interested in? (For example: interviewer, photographer, writer etc.) What experiences in life have you had that contribute to a leadership team? (For example: helped with computers in the classroom, wrote up an interview for a class project, photographed family events.) Describe how you work with others. Tell why you are interested in becoming a part of the leadership team. The paragraph should "flow" when you read it. Don't make this just a list. It should be more like you are "talking" to someone; convincing them that as to why YOU are the ONE!

Conclusion: At least two sentences. Wrap it up by restating your interest in being part of the THES Photo Journalism Leadership Team. Write that you would be a great asset to the team and that you appreciate the consideration. (Say that in your own way.) (This last part is basically thanking the reader for considering your application.)
